10	FINANCIAL MATTERS:  10.1 The Clerk presented Councillors with the Audit Return for the Year End 2008.  The Chairman read out Section 2 and, with all those present in agreement, completed the relevant boxes. The Clerk and Chairman then signed the form.		
	10.2 The Clerk stated that the Audit Return and relevant documents would be delivered to Mr Keith Cockcroft who would, it had been agreed, perform the Internal Audit for 2008.	Int	erk ternal uditor
	10.3 The Invoice from Future-interactive for Hosting the Parish Web-site amounting to £84 was agreed by all present to be paid. Cheque no.000725		
	<ul> <li>10.4 The Annual Insurance Premium due on 01 June 2008 was discussed at length.</li> <li>10.5 It was confirmed that all Councillors and the Clerk were covered if on Parish Council business.</li> </ul>		
	10.6 The Clerk pointed out that although street furniture was covered – to cover the cost of replacing lamp-posts – if a bus shelter was erected than it would have to be added. The extra premium for this would be £13.33 for every £1,000.00 c/w tax.		
	10.7 The Clerk also pointed out that if/when play equipment was installed then the same rate of extra premium would apply - £13.33 for every £1,000.00		
	10.8 The Clerk would again try to obtain a quote for the re-build of the war memorial for insurance purposes. This is to ascertain whether the Allianz quote of £64,000 for insurance purposes is correct.		
	10.9 The premium amounting to £980.78 was agreed by all to be paid. Cheque No.000724	Cl	erk
	10.10 The Clerk reported that no monies for charity were given for the Year End 2008. Councillors asked the Clerk to bring any requests from charities to the next meeting.	Cl	erk
11	CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND:  11.1 A Parishioner spoke with great passion to the meeting about the need for a place in the village for youngsters to enjoy. The vision was for wooden play equipment within a natural setting incorporating flower beds which would be a place for young people and older people of the village to gather. It was to be sited on the Sports Field where the old equipment used to be.		

- 11.2 The project was in the very early stages and the cost was not known as yet, but it was hoped to obtain the assistance of the District Councillor and the PCSO at a meeting to be held on 20 May 2008. Also it hoped that the Parish Council would support such a project.
- 11.3 The Chairman stated that the problem of the proposed site was that to obtain funding the land needed to have a 10-15 year lease. Downside owned this land and in the past it was not willing to lease it. Although he stated that it was worth renewing the request.
- 11.4 The speaker stated that although if sited on the Sports Field it would enhance the Village Hall, another possibility was the car park at the Royal British Legion. This would be more central within the village and, as the RBL was to close in October, the car park was leased from the Duchy. Councillors thought that it would be worth making enquiries.
- 11.5 Cllr Jones felt that a portion of the monies given by the Parish Council to the Village Hall should go towards this project.
- 11.6 Cllr Jeremy Padfield stated that some parishioners were dismayed that the Village Hall Committee had decided to spend £3,000 on tarmacing and fencing the side of the Village Hall. This was a particular concern as a children's centre was being built at the school catering from babies to 11 year olds. Therefore the nursery might not be using the Village Hall premises.
- 11.7 A resident living adjacent to the Village Hall spoke of his concern about removing the hedge and replacing it with a post and rail. He did not object to any work done, but was worried about the type of fencing as he had a small child and a gun dog. Also the hedge acted as a sound barrier. He suggested that a panel fence would be more appropriate. Cllr Jones stated that this was not the right place to discuss this matter and suggested that he should address the Village Committee which would be held in 3 weeks time.

## 12 | BUS SHELTER:

12.1 The Chairman read out a Report from Cllr Quinn regarding the positioning of the proposed bus shelter. The suggestion being that it should be on the same side as the old bus shelter and could be used by those travelling in both directions. The pavement was deemed too narrow for a baby buggy to pass through with quarter end panels and therefore a shelter without end panels was needed.

## The Member of the Public left at this point 8.50 pm.

- 12.2 Questions which were raised were:
  - Was there a penalty by the company installing the shelter if the site was not suitable?
  - Was Planning Permission necessary?
  - Did the Parish Council need the approval of Downside if shelter overhung their property?
  - Would MDC consider moving the pinch points at The Mead?

	12.3 These points would be investigated at a later date after Councillors had looked at the proposed site. It was suggested that a representative from Downside was invited to the site meeting. The suggested date for the site meeting was Thursday 22 June 2008 at the Old Bus Stop.
